4.1 Discussion Item: Update on programs funded by the US Department of Housing and Urban Development	Laurel shared with the group that HASLO has temporarily stopped issuing any housing vouchers, including vouchers for the 50 Now program.		

4.1.1 Housing Choice Vouchers and  
Tenant Based Rental Assistance funding

Due to the rising cost of rent, the cost to HASLO for Housing Choice Vouchers has been increasing. While tenants pay a portion of their income for rent, tenants' incomes have not increased proportionately with rental costs and HASLO has had to make up the difference. This has reduced the amount of funding available for issuing new vouchers.

In the past, even when the Housing Choice Voucher waiting list was closed, HASLO could use vouchers that had been returned and re-issue them to people on the waiting list. HASLO has put a temporary hold on re-issuing vouchers. If HASLO continued issuing vouchers, they would have exceeded the amount that HUD allows them to spend on vouchers before the end of the year.

There are individuals on the 2014 list that have not had a chance to obtain vouchers yet. People on the 2015 list will likely not get a chance to be considered for vouchers until 2017 at the earliest.

Short term rental subsidies have been used to help out. This was funding from the federal HOME program called Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA). This funding was used to house some of the persons on the waiting list who are next in line for vouchers. That has used up the remaining TBRA funding for the current year.

Unless one or more of three options occur, this problem is likely to recur in future years: 1) if clients' incomes increase so that they can pay more of the rent; 2) if rental costs decrease; or 3) if HASLO receives more money for the Housing Choice Voucher





5. Committee Reports	<p>John reported that at the Housing Committee meeting, Martin recommended that each jurisdiction or region in the county consider opening detoxification facilities or program throughout the county. Martin also shared that there is a house up for sale in Pismo Beach that he suggested could be a possible detox facility.
