3.2 HUD Continuum of Care Application	The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban		
timing and process	Development (HUD) Continuum of Care Notice of		
	Funding Availability (NOFA) announcement is		
	expected to come out in July. After HUD publishes		
	the NOFA, the County will issue a Request for		
	Proposals and solicit applications, including renewal		
	applications. There will be an Ad Hoc Grant Review		
	committee convened to review the applications and		
	prioritize them for funding.		
	Last year, the County was given approximately six		
	weeks to complete the process. We are hoping HUD		
	will lengthen the process to eight weeks.		
	We anticipate there will be an opportunity to compete		
	for bonus funding. This is a very competitive process.		
	HUD funded over 8000 projects in the last round and		
	only 25 projects were approved for bonus funding.		
	For the non-bonus funding, HUD typically has given		
	preference to renewal applications, although it has		
	not always had enough funding to renew all		
	applications.		
	There will be new data required in this application,		
	such as the length of time people have been homeless,		
	as measured by HMIS information. HUD will be		
	using this data to help measure community		
	performance.
